

## Sport Volunteer Coalition October Meeting

**Friday 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022**

The Sport Volunteer Coalition met face-to-face at the Australian Sports Commission's (ASC) Melbourne Office on Friday 21st October 2022 to discuss and accelerate the 2022-23 actions noted in the [Sport Volunteer Coalition Action Plan](#). The meeting commenced with the Coalition considering the greatest opportunities to deliver on Year 1 of the Action Plan, and how the Coalition will need to think differently and act to seize these opportunities. Key themes of discussion were the need to continue to drive awareness and understanding of the plan and reposition the value of sport volunteering to communities and individuals. The Coalition also noted their opportunity to drive collaboration and commitment to action across the sector.

Development of an evaluation framework for the Sport Volunteer Coalition Action Plan commenced with a workshop on indicators of success and measurement opportunities. The Coalition also discussed and provided valuable guidance to the ASC on:

- The next phase of the marketing and communications approach for the Coalition Action Plan
- The ASC's new Sport Volunteer of the Year Award, which will be judged by members of the Coalition
- Key sector engagement undertaken by the ASC and members of the Coalition, and future engagement opportunities
- Key projects commenced by the ASC to achieve the Year 1 deliverables of the Coalition Action Plan.

Coalition members also shared project updates on sport volunteering initiatives that they are engaged in outside of the Coalition, driving connections and collaboration amongst individuals and organisations.

The Coalition will next convene in November 2022 to judge the ASC Sport Volunteer of the Year Award.
